

## **Regarding Safety**

## **Program Goals**

The Bilingual Course is an English only Cultural immersion camp.

This camp is a more generic Summer Camp held at a camp ground. Children sleep in bunk beds segregated into groups of 4-8. Each day there are scheduled activities such as crafts, games, sports, treasure hunt, camp fire and so forth.

Apart from pizza making or a BBQ all meals are provided by the camp cafeteria. Japanese campers come to this camp for the opportunity to put into practice the English they learn in classrooms. This camp is held in its entirety at a camp facility.

A certain level of English proficiency is required for Japanese children to be accepted into this camp so most Japanese children shouldn't have a problem with conversing in English. Children of ages 6-12 are able to join.



# **Program Goals**

The Summit Course is a specialized program designed for advanced learners and future youth leaders.

While there are still many fun activities included in the camp, there are more academic elements involved such as discussions and some basic worksheets. This course includes multiple field trips and mini events such as visiting places of historical significance, participating in workshops and experiencing Japanese culture first hand.

This course if usually suited to upper grade elementary school students or even junior high school students who have an interest in improving communication skills, interpersonal skills and learning about Japanese culture.

Depending on the camp, the accommodation will be either entirely or at least in part in a hotel. Visits to theme parks, hotel accommodation, special meals and authentic cultural experiences are all part of the Summit Course. In essence, this is less a traditional summer camp and more of a cultural tour experience.

For the SUMMIT COURSE, we conduct interviews to:

- 1. Confirm a certain level of proficiency in listening and speaking English.
- 2. Confirm the maturity of the participant and their willingness to be a team leader.

This program is designed for children who meet these criteria and aim to further enhance their communication and leadership skills.


